
Completed by 255 caregivers

COVID-19 vaccine

Caregivers were asked "When a vaccine for COVID-19 is available to you, do you intend for you and/or others in your household to receive it?" There was an increase in wanting to get the COVID-19 vaccine from our last survey.



Top two reasons why people were **unsure** are:

"concerned that it may not be safe" and what information to trust"

People would feel more comfortable about household members receiving the covid-19 vaccine if there would be:






This is much higher than the current national average.

Effects on caregivers

Caregivers report improved emotional or mental health.



Caregivers also are more hopeful for the future.



Year in review

Caregivers were **overall satisfied** with the 2020-2021 **school experience**.



69%
were satisfied.

The other 31% were neither satisfied nor dissatisfied, dissatisfied or very dissatisfied.

As of early July, **concern** of the impact of COVID-19 on families **has decreased**.
